- Objectives for a Clinical Medicine Rotation
  - Perform a comprehensive and a focused assessment of a patient based on the clinical presentation and setting, and develop a differential diagnosis based on your findings.
  - Develop rapport and trust with patients and their families.
  - Appropriately order and interpret diagnostic studies and identify the most likely diagnosis.
  - Develop a management plan for further evaluation, referral and treatment based on the nature of the problem and the patient's individual preferences and available resources.
  - Demonstrate proficient and appropriate use of procedural skills, both diagnostic and therapeutic.
  - Provide appropriate patient education, utilizing different approaches based on individual patient needs.
  - Thoroughly and legibly document and orally present patient findings and management plans.
  - Effectively work with other members of the interprofessional team when delivering patient care.
  - Perform literature searches and reviews to answer clinical questions.
  - Demonstrate a broad and developing knowledge of the pathophysiology and molecular basis of diseases, the clinical presentation, diagnostic evaluation and criteria, pharmacologic and nonpharmacologic management plans, complications, prognosis and strategies for early detection and prevention of diseases.
